Palm Sunday REQUIEM

The Chancel Choir will present REQUIEM by John Rutter, with string and wind accompaniment, on Palm Sunday, April 14. Requiem is a Latin word meaning "rest". It is part of the opening words of the Roman Catholic Mass for the Dead,

which is spoken or sung in Latin. Born in London in 1945, John Rutter is widely known as a composer and director. His REQUIEM, set in English and Latin, has become perhaps the most performed requiem of our time, following in the footsteps of the Mozart and Verdi REQUIEMS.

Discover the music within the REQUIEM—

With texts from the Requiem Mass and the 1662 Book of Common Prayer, the seven sections of the work form an arch-like meditation on themes of life and death: the first and last movements are prayers to God the Father on behalf of all humanity, movements two and six are psalms, movements three and five are personal prayers to Christ, and the central Sanctus is an affirmation of divine glory. Gregorian chant is used, in fragmentary or disguised form, at several points.


Timothy Mbise . . .


