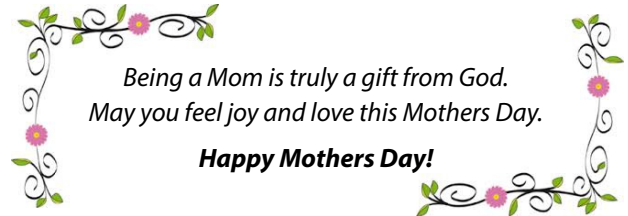

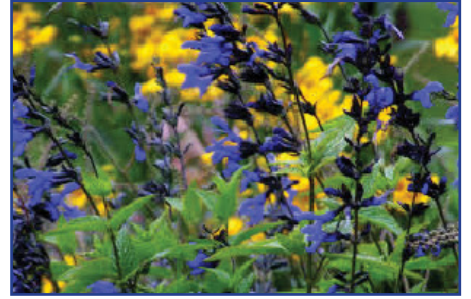

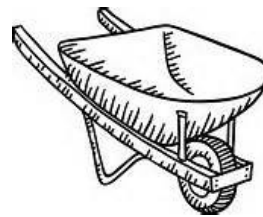

Music Ministries

“This is the feast of victory for our God!”

Lutheran worship traditionally includes a “hymn of praise,” shortly after an opening hymn and an invocation. On April 19, our first Sunday to celebrate Holy Communion since Easter, we restored this peculiarly Lutheran element of worship.

“Feast” = “bread and wine” is a simple enough connection for us to grasp, but the purpose has deeper meanings and symbolisms. When we sing “This is the feast” on a Church holiday, or any communion Sunday, we are celebrating Christ’s victory over death. Drawing directly from the description of heaven in the book of Revelation, our voices are joined to that heavenly throng as we sing with them, “Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!” (Revelation 5:12)

The Old Testament foretells this banquet in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

*“On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples
a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines,
of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines
strained clear.*

*And he will destroy on this mountain
the shroud that is cast over all peoples,
the sheet that is spread over all nations;
he will swallow up death forever.*

*Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces,
and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the
earth,
for the Lord has spoken.”*

(Isaiah 25:6-8)

During the Church seasons of Advent and Lent, which are preparatory times for the Christmas and Easter seasons that follow them, there is no hymn of praise. During the Epiphany season, just after Christmas, we frequently use “Glory to God in the Highest,” a traditional hymn that dates back to the earliest centuries of Christianity. Still in use as a regular part of the Roman Catholic Mass, it is common for Lutheran churches to sing a “Gloria” on a Sunday when Holy Communion is not observed.

Tradition is often shaped by a creative tension of historical practice and local custom. A common variation at FPLC is to replace the hymn of praise with an appropriate anthem by one of our musical ensembles. Like any element of liturgy, a hymn of praise serves to unify our voices in prayer and praise as God’s people; it also serves as a means of helping us see our place in the broad history of the Church and gives us a means to look forward to the marriage supper of the Lamb.

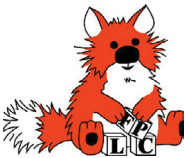
Fox Point Lutheran Church and Team Triumph
