A Heart Too Big

My dear friend and hairdresser for fifteen years passed away unexpectedly a few weeks ago. He died of an “enlarged heart”. He was only fifty-one years old. I had just seen Kevin the week before and he seemed to be feeling fine. We had our usual laughs, our spiritual conversations, and he gave me his usual bear hug when I departed. I still cannot believe he is gone. He was a man of such strength and wisdom, kindness and generosity, and he had a passion for helping others.

His love touched the lives of so many people. Kevin did not have an easy life, but he had a wonderful outlook on how people should be cared for and respected. He was always helping friends in need by providing them a place to stay and helping them financially. He always commented on how blessed he was to work at a job he truly loved and make a good living. He wanted to share his blessings.

Kevin was the rock of his large family. Even though he did not marry or have children, his nieces and nephews were “his kids”. When I met them at the funeral, I felt like I knew them already. Kevin always talked about them and displayed their pictures at his station. As Kevin’s sister Kelly said at his funeral, “Kevin died of an enlarged heart. He gave more in his fifty-one years than most people give in a hundred.” Kevin’s heart was too big for him to be physically healthy, but in every other way it was the perfect heart. What a legacy he leaves to all of us who were blessed to know him. After my last appointment, he gave me a book his Mom had written called “Nuggets, Pieces of Gold For Living.” I read it when I got home and called later to thank him for this precious book. I told him what a dear friend he was and that I loved him; he shared the same sentiment. That is my last memory of him, and I will treasure it forever.

Every day is a gift. Let your heart be too big! Find the joy in giving to others and you will be blessed a million times over.

Been Putting off that Opportunity to Volunteer?

Consider taking dinner to Serenity Inn. Three times a month our members prepare a meal at home, take it warm to the Inn, and have dinner and fellowship with the residents who are men in recovery from alcohol and/or drug abuse. The conversation over dinner is edifying, especially for our young people.

Our assigned dates are the second Thursday, the third Friday, and the fourth Wednesday of each month. Open dates are these: Thursdays: Sept. 12, & Dec. 12; Fridays: Sept. 20, Oct. 18, Nov. 15, Dec. 20; Wednesdays: Sept. 25, Oct. 23, & Dec. 25. Because the census is up at the house, 10-12 residents, the Inn is at or near capacity! We on the SI Board have been waiting for this day, but it is a lot for one family to take on. You may want to consider signing up with another family to lighten the shopping/cooking load.

Fox Trot 5K Training Program—Last Chance!

Do you want to complete a 5K race and don't know where to begin?

You can still benefit from the training program by signing up and attending the rest of the sessions starting Monday July 8.

The program is geared toward the new runner, former runner, non-runner, or walker who has always wanted to finish a 5K and needs some weekly motivation. This is a progressive course which will focus on completing a longer distance each week.
