Clinic at FPLC in the Pine Room—Sunday, October 7, 8:30-Noon

A flu clinic provided by Wheaton Franciscan Home Health will be held on October 7. The cost of the flu vaccine will be \$30.00(age 10 and up). A pneumonia vaccine will also be available (16 years and older) for \$80.00. All Medicare Part B and Medicare Advantage insurances will be accepted as payment. Your card(s) must be presented at the clinic in order to bill the insurance. Otherwise, payment by cash or check made out to WFHH&H will be accepted. Each vaccine recipient will receive a receipt for the payment made, which may be used for reimbursement purposes. Sign up will begin on Sunday, September 23.
