If breast-feeding you are eligible to donate. 3 - You may not donate until 12 months after returning from travel to a malarious area.

Barbara Froemming has the recipe for staying young: live life to the fullest. Her busy schedule allows her to share her knowledge, enjoy rich experiences, and serve—with a purpose.

Barb grew up in Peoria and attended UW-Madison where she received a degree in Home Economics Education and met her beloved husband Jack, a dedicated usher and property chairman at church until his death. They moved to Milwaukee, where Barb taught for 2 years, then to Virginia while Jack was in the service, and then back here, where she spent 25 years teaching at Glen Hills Middle School after their children were born.

Barb is actively connected to her family and friends, her church, her heritage, and our community. She served on the national board of Kappa Delta for 9 years and is now on the board of the local alumnae group, recently hosting their auction which raises money for groups that help children such as Ronald McDonald, the MACC Fund, and Meta House, which supports women struggling with substance abuse and their kids. Every two months, Barb spends an afternoon teaching women in transition about healthy eating, nutrition, and how to cook.

Honoring her mother's traditions, project-oriented Barb serves as president of the Swedish-American Historical Society of Wisconsin. They produce a mid-summer event at Old World Wisconsin, and on December 13, they will join Lutherans in the Nordic countries and all over the world in celebrating St. Lucia Day. Her son John is taking his daughter Ella to Sweden for the festival. He and his wife Courtney live in Maryland with their four children, and Barb's son Jim and his wife Middy, Bayside residents, have two daughters.

At church, Barb shares her faith with others. She is coordinator of the Kitchen Angels, who handle receptions for funerals and keep our kitchen in top shape, as well as the facilitator of the Women's Club which meets monthly. She's been a member of the same small group since 2007. In January, she will teach 5th grade Confirmation students how to bake bread, and some will be used for Communion. She also oversees the delightful annual Christmas Cookie exchange coming up on December 17.

In summer, you'll find Barb in the garden continuing Jack's passion for growing award-winning dahlias. One of their walls is filled with ribbons Barb won at the State Fair and the Wisconsin Dahlia Show, where all of her entries took a first in August. She also enjoys traveling, especially going all over the country and to Sweden to do genealogical research.

Oh, and on her agenda right now is coordinating a reunion for her high school classmates in Peoria. They're all celebrating their 80th birthdays.

Amy Beno’s connection to our church goes back a long way. While she was studying elementary ed at Augustana College, she taught Sunday School at a church in Moline which was then home base for our own Pastor Bill. After four years as a 3rd grade teacher, she became Director of Children’s Ministries at a church in Naperville, then moved with her husband Chuck and two babies to Atlanta where she served as an assistant director in the same ministry.

Early in their marriage, the Benos became involved in a unique church-based program—one she is replicating at Fox Point. Her position is underwritten by the Siebert Foundation, and her title is as expansive as her duties--part-time Director of Family and Marriage Ministry and Life Groups. She has already made a big impact, and her ultimate goal is to ensure that everyone in our church feels connected and has the chance to learn and grow.

Amy’s first effort is focused on couples with children in grades K5 through 6. More than 40 showed up for her two Sunday night potluck suppers. The kids enjoyed activities while the adults got to know each other, watched a faith video, and discussed it afterward. They enjoyed it so much that another is planned for January.

Amy’s ultimate goal is to have the parents form smaller *Life Groups*—ideally 8 to 10 adults who will get together regularly, hiring a baby sitter hired to entertain the kids. The philosophy behind the concept is simple: in addition to worshipping together at church, the couples will get to know each other well, share their lives, strengthen their families and their faith, and reach out to serve others.

Next on Amy’s agenda—*Life Groups* that involve people of different ages at different stages-- empty nesters, new members, and others. She is also putting together a Home Pointe Resource Center where you can get information on all kinds of subjects—among them, marriage, parenting, grandparenting, and caring for aging parents. In addition, she is creating “reconnecting bags”—little gift bags that show our church cares about our members—for example, new moms. She would also like to see more fun and fellowship intergenerational activities like the Chili Throwdown.

Devoted to her husband and their sons, John, Josh and Jake who are 8, 6 and 4, Amy works from home for Manpower on recruiting and also volunteers, currently serving as co-president of the PTO at Richards. She exercises, loves to cook from scratch, and is very interested in health and nutrition (“much to my family’s chagrin”). She enjoys shopping, traveling to visit family and friends, and creating specialties like the bath salts she made for the Boutique. Introduce yourself to Amy. Her enthusiasm and ideas are catching!

Small Groups/Serving

Developing your Spiritual Roots

During the springtime, all the grass in Southern California turns green, the wildflowers and poppies bloom, and it's really pretty. But the moment the rains stop, the hills turn brown again. Why? Because the grass has no roots. It can't go down deep enough to get water from the springs that are deep beneath the ground. When there are no roots, when a plant is in shallow soil, it may initially sprout and look good, but it doesn't last. The plants wither quickly because they don't have roots. Luke 8:13 says, *"The seeds that fell on rocky ground are the people who gladly hear the message and accept it. But they don't have deep roots, and they believe only for a little while. As soon as life gets hard, they give up"* (CEV).

A lot of times we hear God's Word and get excited about it, but we don't allow it to change us. We react emotionally and are moved impulsively, but we don't take the time to let it sink in. None of us look to be shallow. We want to have deep spiritual roots so that when recession comes, we're able to keep bearing fruit. When the rough winds come and somebody in your family gets sick or somebody dies, the trial doesn't blow you away, because you've got roots.

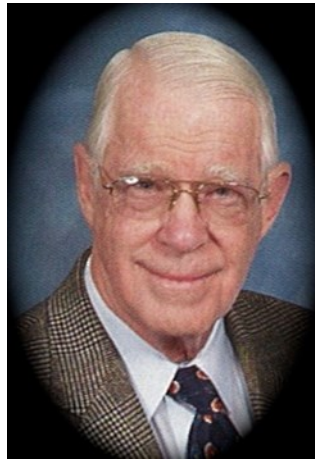
One way to develop spiritual roots is to engage in weekly small group time with other believers. Within small groups meaningful relationships are developed that go beyond the surface. You learn from the people in your small group as you encourage each other and your roots go deeper.

Remembering Ed Hipke



Edward M. Hipke

October 24, 1932 – December 3, 2013

Our church has lost a good friend, a very special human being, and a dedicated and valuable member. Ed Hipke died on Tuesday, December 3 and is survived by his beloved wife Sharon, his daughter Heather and husband Cory, his son David and wife Julia, and four grandchildren, Erica, Christopher, Sophia and Joshua. Ed was the ultimate gentleman, soft spoken with a wry sense of humor. He was caring, a good friend, easy to be around, very intelligent, and interested in many topics. He served on our church Council as President and Vice President.

Ed poured his heart into his work as a member of the Property Committee from 1996 on. He was very devoted to and very protective of our church grounds. He was extremely generous with his time and talents, committed to keeping the buildings in top shape and insuring that the grounds and landscaping were always beautiful—like a park.

Almost every Saturday, you could see Ed in his jeans weeding the beds and trimming the bushes around the church. He was so meticulous that he put all of the refuse into the trunk of his handsome car and drove it away. He personally replanted the beautiful pots at the east and west doors with each change of season. A graduate of Country Day, the Choate School, and UW-Madison, Ed remained true to his home town, living in the same home on Regent Road in Fox Point that he and Sharon bought when they were married. They joined our church in 1962.

Ed's funeral will be held Saturday, December 14, 2013 at Fox Point Lutheran Church.

His family will greet friends from 1:00 – 3:00pm. The service to celebrate Ed's life will begin at 3:00pm.
