Magnificat

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit has rejoiced in God my savior"

So begins Mary's song, The Magnificat, a classic text that lifts up God's salvation plan and helps us prepare for Christmas. The Magnificat text has been set to music in the western church for centuries, from beautiful, plaintive Renaissance choirs to full orchestral versions and everything in between.

On Sunday, December 16, we will present a new musical setting of the text, by American composer Mark Hayes. Hayes combines some of the original Latin text, Magnificat anima mea, with the full text in English. Our chancel choir will be joined by a chamber orchestra, and we will close worship with a festive carol medley.

Tanzania

Help The Rest Reach The Summit!

Thanks to the generosity of our congregation, nine young people in Tanzania are heading to college. Only seven more need our help! All of them have more than earned the opportunity to get a degree and give back to their country.

Statistics show that it might be easier for students to climb Mt. Kilimanjaro than to qualify for college! As you know, it's one of the poorest countries in the world. Too many children do not ever complete primary school or do not have the opportunity to attend secondary school. Thanks to your contributions, we're able to send \$10,000 a year to provide secondary school scholarships so some teens in our partner parishes can continue. Then—imagine the first day in secondary school and confronting the fact that all your classes will now be taught in English rather than your native Swahili!

At the end of high school, only 18% of the students pass the test to take two years of mandatory pre-college courses. Our applicants completed those rigorous courses successfully and have been accepted for college. All they need now is our financial support.

Compared to what tuition here costs for a year, it's a bargain... and a road to success for our young friends. You can "adopt" a student individually or join with friends or your small group here at church. Contributions of any size are welcome!

Maria Mathayo – Maria is in her second year at Mukumira University, a recipient of one of our 2017 tuition scholarships. She's majoring in education with a focus on Kiswahili and hopes to start a small business so she can earn enough to build and teach at a small primary school and provide jobs for others. Maria's father died five years ago, and her mother has encouraged her to study hard and is working to help her with personal

expenses as is Maria's husband. *Annual Tuition: \$775*

Loveness Nnko – Loveness is seeking a Bachelor's degree in Human Resource Management at the University of Dar es Salaam. Her parents encouraged her to pursue her dream—helping the people in her community to improve their quality of life. She believes her college education will enable her to strengthen her leadership skills, broaden her world view, and advance her career. *Annual Tuition: \$450*

Tanzania 2019 "It Will Change Your Life Forever"

The Tanzania Outreach Partnership Committee is gathering names of those interested in going on a 2-week Mission Trip to Tanzania in October 2019.

It's your chance to see first-hand the positive difference our congregation makes in the lives of our friends in the Meru Diocese—people who have next to nothing but still find joy in each and every day.

During this two-week, life-changing, spiritual experience you will:

- Visit & worship at our partner parishes, Usa River and Ngarenanyuki/Momella.
- Meet the people, experience life in their culture and learn about their lives, hopes and dreams.
- Visit the preschools we built...Malaika in Usa River and Ikunda in Ngarenanyuki and see how our littlest students are thriving.
- Spend time with Mama Marcy Mariki and experience the joy of distributing dairy goats to the widows whose families benefit from the hundreds of goats you have provided.

- Help build the required goat structures needed in order to receive the gift of a goat.
- Spend time at Nkoaranga Orphanage giving hugs, feeding, holding, reading books and playing games with the most adorable babies/children in all the world.
- Meet some of our high school and university scholarship students and learn about their future plans.
- We are also working to develop a service opportunity for you – a chance to offer hands-on help.
- Cost of the 2-week trip is approximately \$3,500-\$4,000 and includes:
 - Airline tickets
 - 3 Day/2 Night Safari – visiting Ngorongoro Crater & Tarangire National Park.
 - Housing and transportation expenses in Tanzania... which are minimal.

Baraka Kimaro – Baraka is working toward a BA in Education at the University of Dodoma and plans to go on for a Master's. He wants to help young people achieve and believes that educating them will change the world—his world. A professor who's taught him since he started says he has a great attitude and an excellent chance for success—he will achieve his goals. *Annual Tuition: \$375*

Marko Nnko – Marko plans to earn a degree from the Institution of Financial Management in Dar es Salaam. His parents encouraged him to study hard and contributed what they could to his schooling. He is majoring in Social Protection so he can help poor people and communities with economic problems by using risk management strategies—very simply, teaching people how to combat poverty and bring about growth in society. *Annual tuition: \$430*

Loveness Kaaya – Loveness attends the Spring Institute of Business and Science. After having to switch to a certificate level due to lack of money last year, the school wrote urging

us to help her to earn a full degree in Pharmaceutical Studies. Her family can help a little by selling their crops. Loveness credits her desire to succeed to her family's hard work and to a tradition and culture that does not value educating women. As a licensed pharmacist, she would like to develop high quality drugs that will better treat diseases. *Tuition and fees: \$850*

Joachim Mnyambaru – Joachim received our scholarship last year and is continuing at the University of Dar es Salaam, seeking a Bachelor of Science degree with Education. His mother, a diabetic, has raised seven children alone in absolute poverty, and he gives her credit for teaching him the important things: cooperating with others, helping people in need, being moral, and working hard to rescue his family and others from ignorance, poverty and disease. His goal is to teach students to love physics and become engineers to help industrialize his country and use geography to conserve and manage the environment. *Tuition: \$700. With room and board: \$1600.*

For more than a decade, Fox Point Lutheran church has offered a ministry to men and women grieving the loss of their spouse or another person close in their lives. Mom, Dad, child. It's been called Good Grief. It's been a good, effective small group ministry. People come and go. Lives have become healthier. There's been internal spiritual growth, emotional growth, a maturing understanding of the dynamics of dying and grieving etc.

While there is change in the group, i.e. new people coming, others 'moving on', the existing group wants to share beyond what we are now. So much of our fellowship is wedded to fabulous relationships we believe others can enjoy and appreciate. Even when the issue isn't death, dying and grieving, all kinds of others concerns, some big, others small, are honored.

Few groups laugh as much as we sometimes do. We have fun, fellowship and faith, most of which is woven around practical concerns in our lives. Sometimes we talk about retirement issues, i.e. should I be looking to retire? Where? etc. Or, I've been diagnosed with this or that. We've even helped give

guidance to buying a new set of tires! And sometimes we dig deeper in understanding God's word and our relationship with Him.

No topic is off limits, but every concern is kept within the group. What happens in the Pine Room (where we often meet) stays there unless it results in proactive actions traveling the trails and bumps in the road of life. And, if you are lonely, there isn't a better, safer group than this to gather with once a week.

You are welcome. It's Your Move. Open arms and spirits welcome you to live in the light of one another joined in fellowship and growing in the light of Jesus who says, "come to me, all who labor and are laden and I'll give you rest".

We've all been there, but often it is best with a companion.
