July 23, 2020

Hidden Impact of Segregation

Residential segregation did not happen by accident – and it has many damaging ramifications for our communities' and country's well-being. This talk uncovers the little known political, economic, and social forces that created and maintain residential segregation locally and nationally. In a lecture that is both data-based and engaging, Reggie Jackson illuminates the roles of federal and local governments, the real estate industry, and a de-industrializing economy in creating this situation.

August 6, 2020

Urban Myths or Realities? MKE Matters for Suburbanites

Many people of good conscience who live in the suburbs, exurbs and rural communities encircling WI's largest city have questions about what's really going on in the city, whether and how this might affect them and their children now and into the future. We examine such questions as: What's the deal with black-on-black crime? Why do there seem to be more black youth in prison than in college? Are MPS schools failing, or it is that black kids and parents fail to properly value education? Is poverty moving into the suburbs?

August 20, 2020

Unconscious Bias: Can We See Our Own Blind Spots?

Incorporating fun, interactive exercises, we explore how our brains serve as effective pattern-making machines that unconsciously "prime" us for stereotyping – whether we intend it or not. We examine how the concept of race developed throughout US history and how this history and human tendency towards bias helped create and maintain today's systemic racial inequities. We explore together how bias affects daily life, and whether something this difficult to perceive can ever be changed.

September 3, 2020

Building Racial Understanding

How did we become so divided by race? In this presentation, we take a close look at the forces that have created and maintained racial divisions throughout our nation's history. We also present some common sense solutions that individuals and institutions can use to move us toward an equitable, diverse society in which all Americans can thrive.

Reggie Jackson has been a much sought-after speaker and published writer for over a decade. Reggie specializes in sharing seldom-told stories and facts about the experiences of African-Americans and other peoples of color past and present. He is a Co-Founder and Lead Trainer/Consultant for Nurturing Diversity Partners, a consulting firm that fosters diversity, inclusion, and equity within institutions and communities.

Kids Working to Succeed at All Peoples Church

Every summer All Peoples has a variety of programs for the kids in their neighborhood. One of the biggest involves kids working in their community garden—helping to grow and maintain the plants used in the church's weekly food distribution program. The kids are paid a small amount which is divided into savings, spending and giving back. There is also Bible Study and garden education (both online). In the past, groups have volunteered to make individual lunches for this program.

Even in the time of COVID-19, this program continues through the dedication of All Peoples staff and volunteers—with social distancing and safety protocols in place. The need for lunches hasn't gone away, in fact it's more important than ever!

Introducing Grocery Bag Lunches

The idea behind the Grocery Bag Lunches is that they include enough items to make lunches for a family of 5 for 3 days. Items can be in family-size or individual treats (like fruit cups). The basic idea is to provide a lunch that considers both nutrition and fun. If you have a

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garden of your own, producing extra lettuce, tomatoes and such, those are great things to share! Ideas for lunches include:

- Bread and/or buns
- PB & J, pack of lunch meat, pack of cheese, small jar of mayo
- Hot lunch items, like a pack of hot dogs, baked beans, ravioli, frozen pizza
- Bacon (if you are sharing lettuce & tomatoes from your garden)
- Chips or pretzels
- Pickles
- Orange juice or milk
- Cookies or brownies or bars
- Fruit or fruit cups

If you would like to include a little note from your family or your church, a picture of your garden, a suggested menu to go with the things you packed, that would be extra lovely! Pack everything for one family into a double-bagged paper grocery bag. If it doesn't fit, you can use 2 bags per family. Please use good sanitary practices as you shop and pack the bag.

Backpacks Needed!



Our Tanzania Partners Are Facing New Challenges— How You Can Help!

Extensive Flooding and Pandemic Concerns in Tanzania

In Arusha, where the Diocese of Meru operates, farmers had planted most of their crops, livestock keepers were happy, and pastures were in abundance. On April 22, the Parish pastor reported that due to the rains, 15 families lost their homes and livestock when they were washed away by the floods. The displaced families are currently living in a school and are relying on support from the parish. Their neighbors are unable to help because they lost their crops to the flooding. Additionally, Usa River and Ngarenanyuki parishes are suffering because of COVID and a 50% decrease in offerings.

FPLC’s Tanzania Outreach Committee is donating \$500, and we’d like to invite our members to make a gift to help us raise an additional \$500 matching gift. No donation amount is too small!

Nkoaranga Lutheran Hospital Needs a Blood Chemistry Analyzer
