August 6, 2020; 7-8:30 pm

The 2.2 Million: The History and Human Cost of Mass Incarceration

In this talk we expose the roots of our country's current system of mass incarceration, including the laws and policies which have made it possible to incarcerate over 2 million Americans. Wisconsin exemplifies many of the issues regarding mass incarceration, so we examine its correctional system in detail: where and why we've built prisons around the state, who's in them, why our prison population keeps growing – and the costs to both families and communities back home.

August 20, 2020; 7-8:30 pm Unconscious Bias: Can We See Our Own Blind Spots?

Incorporating fun, interactive exercises, we explore how our brains serve as effective pattern-making machines that unconsciously "prime" us for stereotyping – whether we intend it or not. We examine how the concept of race developed throughout US history and how this history and human tendency towards bias helped create and maintain today's systemic racial inequities. We explore together how bias affects daily life, and whether something this difficult to perceive can ever be changed.

September 3, 2020; 7-8:30 pm Urban Myths or Realities? MKE Matters for Suburbanites

Many people of good conscience who live in the suburbs, exurbs and rural communities encircling Wisconsin's largest city have questions about what's really going on in the city, whether and how this might affect them and their children now and into the future. We examine such questions as: What's the deal with blackon-black crime? Why do there seem to be more black youth in prison than in college? Are MPS schools failing, or it is that black kids and parents fail to properly value education? Is poverty moving into the suburbs? We'll also wrap up the series with some common sense solutions that individuals and institutions can use to move us toward an equitable, diverse society in which all Americans can thrive.

Some FPLC staff and volunteers had an opportunity to tour their operations when we dropped the blankets off. In a very small space (which is in the process of being renovated,) MBHS has been offering a "Doorway Ministry" every Tuesday & Thursday from 11am – 1 pm with clothing; nonperishable food, fresh produce, household items, furniture, bicycles, and more to serve 250 neighbors a week in this food desert.

As we all know, the food we eat often stems from our family traditions, cultural traditions and regions of the country (or world!) from which we came. MBHS tries to honor that in the food they provide their neighbors. Given that, we are looking for a specific list of items:

- canned beef & chicken
- sardines
- Vienna sausagesbaked beans

• Spam

- canned yams canned green beans
- canned corn
- bars of soap
- energy bars
- chicken noodle/dumpling soup hand sanitizer
- boxes of cereal
- toilet tissue and diapers

Hygiene Kits for SI

Fox Point Church

Many of you

will already know about Serenity Inns – the transitional living facility

in Milwaukee for men who are in recovery from drug and/or alcohol abuse. FPLC participates generously in many aspects of Serenity Inns' operation, including serving on the board or leadership team, providing meals 3 evenings per month, helping to organize the annual "Celebration" fundraiser, and working arduously to rehab and furnish the Alumni House apartments. That facility has now been fully rehabbed, thanks to many members of Fox Point Church and a very special friend to Serenity named Bill Buehler!

Last summer, during the month of August, our congregation collected personal hygiene items and confirmation students assembled them into 48 kits, which were delivered to Serenity. As most of the men arrive from prison or detox centers, they come with nothing. There are approximately 50 men arriving each year to participate in the rehab program, so our project will again provide enough supplies to cover about a year of residents.

This August, there will be a sign-up available online on the church website. You will find a list of items that you can take with you as you shop, and we ask that you provide all the items on the list, which is enough for one resident. Please write your name on the printed list of items, then return it and the items to church in a large plastic bag (the famous red Sendik's bag should hold everything except the shower caddy). There will be a collection bin outside the east door at church on Monday mornings through August.

This is a wonderful family activity and provides an opportunity to talk to your children about drugs and alcohol and the dangers they pose, both short-term and long-term. For questions, please contact Minna Smith at 414-852-1525 or mokismith@aol.com.

- ____ deodorant (not gel style)
- ____ shaving cream (small)
- ____ Kleenex (small individual pack)
- ____ Chapstick or similar lip product
- ____ comb thick "Afro" style, if possible

Notes:

- 1. Dollar Stores/equivalent offer good value for most of these items
- 2. Shower caddies can also be found at Target or Kohl's
- 3. A washcloth, disposable razor & Q-tips will be added to each kit before delivery to Serenity Inns, as they are less expensive when bought in bulk.
- 4. Please return the hygiene items by August 30 in a heavy plastic bag similar to those from Sendik's. The shower caddy does not need to fit in the bag.
- 5. Please do not include extra items in this bag. If you wish to donate other items, it will help us if you place those additional items in a separate bag and mark them as such ("extra items" or "miscellaneous donations").

The men arriving at Serenity are very appreciative of your support and grateful to have their own set of hygiene items. It gets them off to a good start with their rehabilitation process. THANKS SO MUCH!
