Continuing Our Mission and Rising to the Challenge

Our new Afghan neighbors arrived on December 27.

Lutheran Social Services (LSS) had advised us that as part of our commitment to this family we should anticipate expenses of approximately \$10,000.

A group of your fellow FPLC members are "Pastor's Kids" and witnessed how their fathers, mothers and their congregations aided and supported families in need. They are often referred to as "PKs".

The PKs and their families have joined together as a group to challenge other FPLC families to match their \$6,400 commitment to create an "Afghan Family Fund". The funds will be available to cover the current and future expenses of our newly resettled family. Please, if you feel called to help in this way, mail in your donation or drop it off at the new Church Office. Please mark the donation "Afghan Family Fund".

With the exception of Members who are Indigenous People (or a descendant of one) the rest of us are all immigrants or descendants of immigrants. Please pray for the family and our efforts, to help them feel at home in their new community.

During the past 11 years, bread for communion has been made by members of the congregation. This wonderful tradition began when our fifth graders, who make bread for the congregation as part of their first Communion preparation, asked if we could use homemade bread instead of wafers for communion. If you have helped at previous bread baking demonstrations, you already know how to make the recipe and are a perfect volunteer candidate. A real plus for volunteering—your kitchen will smell so good as the bread bakes!

Every year, the organization purchases gifts for children of men and women who are in Wisconsin's prisons. The inmates choose the toys from a catalog and write notes to their kids which are attached to your cards. For some children, this is the only communication they receive from their incarcerated mothers and fathers all year. Last year, more than 4,000 children received presents and cards.

Hello!

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness and self-control. Against such things there is no law." – Galatians 5:22-23

Naomi Erdmann was my first-grade teacher; she taught me how to read and later helped countless others as a professor at Nazareth College. She completed her masters and doctorate degrees earning the title of Dr. Erdmann, but for me, she will always be Mrs. Erdmann, who as we sat in a circle on a wooden floor gently encouraged each of us to read aloud. I've not forgotten her kindness and love, tempered with firmness, fun and learning as she delivered those values from Galatians to her little scholars. One of her students said: "I hit the jackpot with Dr. Naomi Erdmann. The lessons she taught our class remained with me throughout my entire teaching career."

Each Christmas I receive a lovely card and letter from Mrs. Erdmann who is now 89 years old and has had a grueling year. She recently lost her beloved husband and a 21-year-old grandson. Yet she continues to inspire me, passing along love, joy, and peace from her world to mine. She wrote: "I pray we are all safe, well, and our hopes come true in 2022. Please don't let a day pass you don't remember to tell your loved ones how dear they are to you." Her love for others doesn't miss a beat! Mrs. Erdmann's light shines right through, the fruits of the spirit evident in the life God has given to her.

"Dear friend, I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, even as your soul is getting along well." 3 John 1:2

Holy One, thank you for continually reminding us of the love and kindness we have been shown in our lives; of those healers, teachers, pastors, friends, family and even strangers who have contributed to our paying that love and kindness forward to others. Amen.

Let's continue to do some good this week! - Mary
