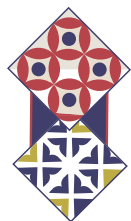

Hello!

"Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come

and see you or only hear about you in my absence, I will know that you stand firm in one Spirit, striving together as one for the faith of the gospel, without being frightened in any way by those who oppose you. " – 1 Philippians 1:27-28

It was right in front of my nose, I must have looked at it a thousand times, but never really seen it. The label on my computer read "Built Reliably For Real Life." It reminded me of a message we've heard from Pr. Bill at Fox Point Church for many years – "Real Faith For Real Life." Just how do we get equipped with real faith? Like this computer that keeps on running like the Energizer Bunny, how does God prepare us to be reliably loving, kind, faithful workers in his kingdom? Instructions for this real life through real faith are everywhere in our book of directions, The Bible. But what to read, where to begin? The key for me is to just read a little each day...it is a wonderful thing that God has such patience!

Joni Eareckson Tada, Evangelical Christian author puts it this way in her book, Diamonds in the Dust, and for me, it's a great compass:

"The words of 1 John 4:19 are so intimate, "We love because He first loved us." If you desire to be free of fear, memorize and meditate on portions of scripture that describe God's love and your need. Read part of John's gospel to hear the heartbeat of Christ just hours before the cross... read Psalm 51 to grasp the bitterness of sin...then enjoy the Song of Songs to find the warm and intimate language of love."

In The Bible, we can read over and over again about how all the pieces of God's loving heart fit together within Jesus, The Holy Spirit and within our own souls. There are so many ancient words to learn from-it is truly a great feast! These are two scriptures that I read every morning:

"This is what the Lord asks of you; Only this; To act Justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God." – Micah 6:8

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart." – Proverbs 3:5

God of love, help us to remember that Christ has no body now on earth but ours, no hands but ours, no feet but ours. Ours are the eyes to see the needs of the world. Ours are the hands with which to bless everyone now. Ours are the feet with which he is to go about doing.
