structure, capabilities, priorities and challenges. It's sure to be an interesting and insightful presentation!



Our members have provided more than 270 goats (and goat food!) for Mama Mariki's program. It's now expanded and called the Hope Seed Initiative.

Each goat goes to a widow raising an orphan or to individuals and groups of people who are very poor. The milk provides food, and when the goat has a kid, it goes to another family. If you would like to purchase goat food or a goat as a gift, you have your choice of:

Food for 4 months – \$25 Food for a year – \$75 Food for 8 months – \$50 *Goat & food for 4 months - \$150



"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." – 2 Corinthians 5:17

Rock Springs is on my Facebook radar because it's my Grandpa Walter's hometown, population 343. Located in the Baraboo River narrows, I've visited and felt right at home. Walter was a brakeman on the railroad and recently I posted a question about it. A lifelong resident named George responded. I don't know George, but he knows Rock Springs history and could be my kin or know someone related to me. He welcomed me like family. It's like that with relationships. We tend to gather with those who are like-minded or know someone who knows someone we know. We enjoy doing the same things and may believe in the same things.

"So, in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Galatians 3:26-29
