- Spend time at Nkoaranga Orphanage giving hugs, feeding, holding, reading books and playing games.
- Meet with our Scholarship Students.
- Visit the Hospital.
- Visit the Coffee Project.
- Go on a 3-day/2-night safari at the Tarangire National Park and Ngorogoro Crater National Park.



We are looking at going the last week of September and the first week of October, 2024.

Cost of the 2-week trip will be approximately \$5,000 that includes everything. We will have more details once we

choose our dates.

It's a residence for men in recovery from alcohol and/or drug abuse in Milwaukee. FPLC has had a long volunteer relationship with SI.

What to expect when volunteering?

You will make dinner for the Inns at home & take it to the Inns on your chosen date. You deliver it warm by 5:45pm (for a 6pm start time) and join them for dinner and conversation. Because the number of residents is around 8-12, two families may want to volunteer together. You will cook for yourselves, the men and the innkeeper. You're usually on your way home by 7 pm.



Stop by the Welcome Desk on Sunday morning or in the office during the week to make your purchases.








Hosts make the coffee and serve the donuts on Sundays. You are still able



Hello!

"So, faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." – Romans 10:17

Our Black and Decker coffee maker provides a noisy greeting in the morning. It's nothing fancy, a \$19.95 Kohl's special that fffts and hisses, skuzzas and gu-lunks a little, that "music" coming from start to finish in the brewing cycle. Rich, dark and hot, it's magic...water through the filter, saturating the ground coffee, first trickling, then streaming into the carafe, ready for me in minutes. My faith is like that-it came to me in fits and starts – and just sometimes a seemingly natural outpouring of wonderful. As our dear Jo Ann Berdelman would say, "it's all good."

"The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" - Luke 17:5

My own situation is likely typical; baptized, confirmed and married in the Lutheran church. Faith, though, while having a firm foundation with Sunday School and encouraged through Bible reading, was absent for much of my life. Looking back, I can see that it went quietly underground for years. Life happened...a divorce, loved ones passing on, friends passing through, fear about finding employment, and that iffy sense about getting older all rising to the surface. Always within me, though, lived that stubborn and wonderful faith, that little kernel being polished in me from childhood. The process didn't take minutes like morning coffee...it took years of God prevailing and walking with me. Faith really never left me at all. Because God's love and patience never left me either...not once.

"Consider it a sheer gift, friends, when tests and challenges come at you from all sides. You know that under pressure your faith-life is forced into the open and shows its true colors. So don't try to get out of any things prematurely. Let it do its work, so you become mature and well developed, not deficient in any way. If you don't know what you're doing, pray to the Father. He loves to help." – James 1: 2-5 The Message
