



Rookwood pottery is classically beautiful. We inherited one special piece, a vase in colors of indigo and burnt umber. With a serpentine impressed design and the artist’s cipher on the bottom, it is distinctively art deco...a wonderful piece. Oh, and one more thing...it has a crack near the rim. It is broken. Perhaps so imperfect for some that it does not merit owning. It is nonetheless precious to us.

Precious...of great worth – when you see these words what comes to mind? It’s different for each of us, but your heart knows the way. In Japan there is a concept called Kintsugi where broken things are repaired with gold, and they become and remain even more precious than when created.
