### A Note from Pastor Bill ~ An Exciting Mission Coming Up!

In January, two of our members and my dear friend are joining me on my third trip to Tanzania. We'll be spending time with the people and our church partners in the Meru Diocese to learn more about their hopes and needs. Our relationship began in 2004, and our continuing partnership is truly a miracle, one that provides hope and concrete support for our Meru friends.



The area is marked by extreme poverty, but the people share a deep, unshakable faith, filling each day with smiles even while facing huge challenges: day-to-day survival, famine, droughts, and critical illnesses. Thankfully, you, our members, have embraced our partnership fully, giving more than \$536,093 so far to help them live better lives.

Your gifts have covered everything from goats that provide milk for widows and orphans to support for their coffee farmers, and a major medical mission.

One of your biggest contributions is supporting education—providing younger generations with a positive future. We help pay high school fees, and our College

Scholarship program is a remarkable success! In a decade, donations from more than 100 of you have covered tuition and books for 84 young adults, giving them the chance to earn degrees and insuring their positive futures.

#### **Coat Drive Results**

We hope it warms your heart to know that hundreds of Milwaukeens will be warmer this winter thanks to your generous donations of coats, hats, mittens, scarves, gloves and socks in the last month.

A conservative estimate of what was donated: 240 new and gently-used coats and 320 winter-wear items such as hats, mittens, socks, gloves, scarves. Many of the winter wear items were lovingly and beautifully made by FPLC's fabric and yarn-based crafts-people.

While we don't need to put a dollar amount on all we do, it sometimes helps quantify the impact of the donations. Conservatively, this donation is estimated to be over \$13,000. Items were donated to: Salvation Army Emergency Shelter, MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary, United Community Center and All Peoples Church.

Thank you to members of FPLC, mostly from our Men's and Women's Clubs, who did all the sorting, packing and delivering of these items to the four organizations. They worked up an appetite for a chili lunch and time to socialize in Fellowship Hall!

#### **Recap of Women's Conference**

Recently, eighty women from FPLC, Redeemer Lutheran church, along with friends and relatives, gathered for a Women's Conference. On Friday night the women met at the Bavarian Bierhaus for appetizers and drinks, where they had time to socialize and then listen to *True Voices*, five minute stories about something that happened to them. Our theme was to share a story of something bad that happened, but then had a silver lining in the end. Women could empathize and get to know others in a deeper way, through this sharing. The emcee of the evening was the wonderful Molly Fay (co-host from the Morning Blend) and member of FPLC.



On Saturday we gathered at FPLC to sit at assigned, mostly intergenerational tables, to meet new people and develop a level of getting to know each other through an ice-breaker and

sharing answers to questions from our fabulous speaker for the day, Pastor Lisa Bates-Froiland from Redeemer Lutheran Church. Lisa has a special talent for helping people feel at ease and encourages developing trust through questions that each table group answers together, then shares with the entire group. In the morning, the topic was the importance of silence in a busy world. In the afternoon, the topic was learning to set up boundaries in our lives to help reduce stress.

An activity in the morning involved the BeeVangelists teaching us to make candles, using exclusively bee's wax.

Bees are synonymous with life and many lessons can be learned from them. In the afternoon, the women filled purses with personal care products and wrote words of encouragement to women who are victims of sexual trafficking, abuse, and homelessness. Thanks so much to



everyone who donated purses, bought items or donated money to fill the purses. The purses will be given to Fresh Start, Inc., an organization in Milwaukee that serves the women with counseling, support groups, job training, a clothes closet, and gives them the courage to change their lives. For the January Women's Club, Nancy Yarbrough, the founder of Fresh Start, Inc. will be the featured

speaker.



Based on the post-event survey, 98% of the women who attended felt that they were very satisfied with the Women's Gathering. They felt the events were inclusive, impactful, relevant, and engaging. They agreed that meeting other faith-based women was beneficial and

encouraged them to be more involved in church activities in the future, including planning to attend next



year's Women's Conference! Sarah Gilday, Kathi Behm, and Gail Sommerfeld (the planning team) would like to thank the staff of FPLC for being so supportive,

our speakers, and all the women who agreed to be a part of our program, whether visible or behind the scenes. We would love to have another Women's Gathering next year, so please think about how you might be a part of it!

#### Knitters and Crocheters Needed! Soap Sacks

Soap Sacks are hand-knit or crocheted drawstring bags that hold a standard size bar of soap. The sacks can be used simply to hold the soap or people can leave the soap in the bag and use it as a soap-filled wash cloth. FPLC will fill each bag with a donated bar of soap and deliver them to our partners in Milwaukee to give to their pantry guests. Some of the guests are homeless or move frequently. They may not have access to soap or washcloths on a regular basis. If you can't make these but would like to help, donate standard-sized bars of soap in our food carts.

If you wish to include a standard-sized bar of soap with the Soap Sacks you donate, please keep the soap in its wrapper before putting it inside the sack. That way it stays clean until it reaches its recipient. Donations can be left in our food donation carts.

See the links below for instructions. If you have a pattern you'd prefer to use, that's fine! We just ask that they be similar in size, have a drawstring or tie to close the sack and that you use cotton yarn.


#### **Makes A Great Hostess Gift!**
