

A New Additional Way of Donating to MBHS

Good news! MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary was nominated and then accepted into the catalog of non-profit organizations to receive Thrivent Choice dollars from people who are members of Thrivent Financial Services!

It's easy to donate; simply log into your Thrivent account, find Thrivent Choice dollars. It will tell you how much you have available to donate and then allows you to type in the name of the organization that you'd like to support and they will send the funds directly to that organization within the next month. MBHS is new to this list, but there are other organizations to choose from as well.

Another opportunity to give through Thrivent is Thrivent Action Plans. The Action Plan allows you to apply for two projects each year, for up to \$250 in seed money to kick start a fundraiser, educational program, or service project.

Knitters and Crocheters Needed! Soap Sacks

Soap Sacks are hand-knit or crocheted drawstring bags that hold a standard size bar of soap. The sacks can be used simply to hold the soap or people can leave the soap in the bag and use it as a soap-filled wash cloth. FPLC will fill each bag with a donated bar of soap and deliver them to our partners in Milwaukee to give to their pantry guests. Some of the

guests are homeless or move frequently. They may not have access to soap or washcloths on a regular basis. If you can't make these but would like to help, donate standard-sized bars of soap in our food carts.

If you wish to include a standard-sized bar of soap with the Soap Sacks you donate, please keep the soap in its wrapper before putting it inside the sack. That way it stays clean until it reaches its recipient. Donations can be left in our food donation carts.

See the links below for instructions. If you have a pattern you'd prefer to use, that's fine! We just ask that they be similar in size, have a drawstring or tie to close the sack and that you use cotton yarn.

Soles for Jesus is a Milwaukee-based non-profit which collects new or used shoes and ships them to impoverished areas in Africa. They rely heavily on volunteers to make this work happen!

Confirmation students have the opportunity to work together organizing, cleaning and packing shoes for shipment. They'll also hear more about the organization and the people it serves—the millions of people living a barefoot life. They are exposed to illness & injury daily without shoes. People cannot go to school or get a job; shoes are required in those places. Even worn shoes are a treasure in a developing country.

We'll need 4 FPLC adults with 25 students. Although you don't need to attend with your student, we do need 4 adults to supervise. Once the parent and student slots on this form are full, we are at their group capacity.

Holiday Helpers

At FPLC, we live by the phrase "many hands make light work", especially when it comes to helping those experiencing food and resource insecurity. A summary of what you



accomplished in November and December:

- Confirmation students baked or purchased about 45 pies for All Peoples Church to hand out with their Thanksgiving meal kits.
- FPLC members donated about 15 turkeys, turkey • breasts and chickens, 20 Thanksgiving meal kits and 20 hygiene kits to All Peoples Church.
- FPLC members purchased, cooked, and sliced over 25 turkeys for The Gathering's Thanksgiving meal.
- On Dec. 6, approximately 65 students made 150 bagged lunches (and made Christmas cards for them), donated and packaged 85 dozen Christmas cookies, donated food for and packed 70 meal kits and donated well over 100 children's gifts! MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary and All Peoples Church were the recipients of these items.



- During both months, our regular food drives were as strong as ever, serving 3 different pantries.
- All these donations total thousands of pounds of items that need to be delivered. A team of 12 FPLC volunteer delivery drivers made run after run making sure all these items got to the various

locations in good shape and on time.

None of this could be done by just a few people. Many hands and hearts helped ensure our brothers and sisters had food to eat and could share in the joy of the season. Many thanks now and always.


