MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary Urgent Appeal

Many of you have participated monthly making 150 bag lunches for MBHS. We will be doing that again Sunday, February 23, so please stop downstairs at 10 am (between services) on that day to

make lunches. Thank you!

What you may not know, is the lunches are handed out the following Tuesday during MBHS's Doorway Ministry program. This ministry serves 80-100 people, including children, disabled and elderly people, some representing households of six or more, in all sorts of living conditions.

Some of the outreach guests live in abandoned buildings, some are under roofs. They include "doubled-up" homeless (living under a roof in crowded conditions) and households at risk of homelessness in the impoverished 53206 zip code. Many guests stay in under-heated or unheated living spaces. One man lives in an unheated garage.

They come to the Doorway Ministry to receive a week's supply of food, hygiene products, coats, blankets, sleeping bags and other essentials. They appreciate receiving bag lunches assembled and delivered by groups who are committed to providing them on a regular basis (like FPLC). The team of front-line staff people and volunteers serve with loving kindness and dedication.

MBHS is a monthly (or more) recipient of food/hygiene items and 150 bag lunches from FPLC. They also receive items from our annual coat/cold weather accessory and blanket drives. You can donate Thrivent Choice dollars to MBHS if you are a member of Thrivent Financial Services as well.

AN URGENT NEED

FPLC has had an Amazon registry set up for MBHS for several years. There are small appliances helpful to guests who don't have a way to heat food, stay cool in the summer and—so urgent right now—to stay warm in the winter. Please consider purchasing a space heater from the registry—it will be sent directly to MBHS and be given to guests during the Doorway Ministry. If you prefer, you can purchase from other places and have heaters sent to the address below. These are the fastest ways to get the items to MBHS but we can take some at FPLC also. Place them in or next to our regular food collection cart.

Serenity Inns Dinner Fellowship

Why is Dinner Fellowship So Necessary?

Serenity Inns is a residence for men in recovery from alcohol and/or drug abuse in Milwaukee. FPLC has a long history of members providing 3 dinners a month and sharing the meal and conversation with the men. Our volunteers know that

providing and sharing a meal with the residents enables the men to share their stories with others, feel the compassion of a caring community and build their communication skills that have suffered during their times of isolation and addiction. Now is a wonderful time to add more volunteers to enjoy this experience of learning, sharing, growth and compassion.

What to Expect When Volunteering

Volunteers make dinner and take it warm to the Inn by 5:45 pm (for a 6 pm start time). The men meet you at your car to carry items inside. Prepare the meal in your cookware (vs buying aluminum pans) if you like because the men will wash it and carry it to the car at the end of the meal. As the number of residents varies, you'll receive an email a week before your date with the number of residents; right now the number is between 9 and 12. You'll be cooking for yourselves, the men and the innkeeper. You're usually on your way home by 7 pm. Two families, friends, small group members etc. are welcome to volunteer together to share the meal prep and dining experience.

What Should We Prepare for Dinner?

Many of us may not be experienced cooking for a group this large. Here are some suggestions from experienced meal providers:

"While they appreciated some of our family favorites, they love meals with a lot of flavor and spice/heat. Expect someone to pull out that bottle of Franks RedHot at every meal!"

"We've done fried chicken, jambalaya, red beans and rice, collard greens, cornbread, a particular favorite, but also meals like barbecued hamburgers and brats are favorites."

"A main dish, 2 sides and a small dessert—like cookies—works well. The men appreciate a good fresh fruit salad, rolls and other salads as well."

"We have served chicken dishes that have gone over well and fresh green salads with fruit. Overall, the men are so grateful for the guests and the food."

"Also, you can never make too much food. Whatever is leftover, the men use for lunches the following day."


Hospital Visits

Knitters and Crocheters Needed! Soap Sacks

Soap Sacks are hand-knit or crocheted drawstring bags that hold a standard size bar of soap. The sacks can be used simply to hold the soap or people can leave the soap in the bag and use it as a soap-filled wash cloth. FPLC will fill each bag with a donated bar of soap and deliver them to our partners in Milwaukee to give to their pantry guests. Some of the guests are homeless or move frequently. They may not have access to soap or washcloths on a regular basis. If you can't make these but would like to help, donate standard-sized bars of soap in our food carts.

This is an ongoing project, so you may donate these any time in our Food Donation Cart or at the

Welcome Desk.

If you wish to include a standard-sized bar of soap with the Soap Sacks you donate, please keep the soap in its wrapper before putting it inside the sack. That way it stays clean until it reaches its recipient. Donations can be left in our food donation carts.

See the links below for instructions. If you have a pattern you'd prefer to use, that's fine! We just ask that they be similar in size, have a drawstring or tie to close the sack and that you use cotton yarn.



Hello!

"His life is the light that shines through the darkness – and the darkness can never extinguish it." – John 1:5

Light! How we crave it! In Svalbard, the northernmost year-round settlement on earth, where the sun does not rise above the horizon for almost three months, it is precious! Called polar night, residents use LED lights strung in shadowy places, candles glow at almost all hours, and wood-burning fireplaces are used for heat...and light. God's natural miracles also bring them skies filled with northern lights. But it is like day has been taken over by night...for a time.

Darkness can take many forms and is so subjective. Might be a medical issue, a child acting out, criticism from a friend or maybe that water heater drip is fast becoming an emergency. Dark days result from the loss of a beloved or stumbling out of a relationship or being hurt by circumstances out of our control. Darkness of mind or physical surroundings always seems to escalate my worries. Lighting a candle or turning on a lamp or pure sunshine can help, but there is another solution too and He's as close as a prayer and He is for all time, not just...for a time.

"The Lord is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The Lord is the defense of my life; Whom shall I dread? – Psalm 27:1

Our brains go into overdrive; we lose sleep, push our feelings down and can even think cringe-worthy thoughts. But His presence is like finding that soft spot in your pillow at night...it's perfect...and it was right there! The mercy and the presence of a personal God...we can rest our weary minds in His light and love every moment of each new day.
