All Creatures Great and Small, The Lord God Made Them All

We had a surprise this week when the office staff noticed a small bird's nest with eggs in the wreath on the front door. It's a rather busy place,

especially on Sunday mornings, so what should we do?

With the help of the Wisconsin Humane Society, we have a lot more knowledge than we started with, and we need your help!



Who Made the Nest?

The nest is likely that of a mourning dove, but it's still up for debate. In the nest (pictured above) you see the dove's two white eggs. Now there are four white eggs!

While the nest looks small for the good-sized bird, that's how they do things and it works for them (they're part of the Tiny House Nation)! The incubation for these eggs is about 10-14 days, then it takes another couple of weeks before they leave home.



Uh, What About That Other Egg???

Those of you with a keen eye will notice the larger brown-speckled egg. That is *not* a mourning dove egg. That belongs to a cowbird. Those scoundrels lay their eggs in

other birds' nests and have those birds raise them! Depending on the host bird, this custom can be helpful or detrimental to both species. Some hosts may knock the Cowbird eggs out of the nest. Cowbird hatchlings have been known to do the same with eggs or newly hatched birds. Cowbirds have a similar incubation time and leave the nest after a couple of weeks or less.

How can you help?

As you are facing the church, please avoid using the left door. We can't help the people-traffic much, but we can reduce the movement of the door. If you see babies with no parents, don't worry—that parent bird is nearby. Please avoid getting any closer to the nest, eggs and eventual birds (hopefully) as you can.

Helpful Information

- Did you know that it is illegal to move or disturb this nest, birds or eggs? They're protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act!
- We've had this happen a couple of times before at FPLC. There are predators, weather and all kinds of things that can cause the eggs to fall out or never hatch at all. We have only seen the parent on the nest once, but they are nearby; probably because so many folks are using the door. So while we hope the birds hatch and thrive, you never know.
- While we contacted the Wisconsin Humane Society and did some internet research, we're not bird experts. Just some folks trying to help out some of the littlest creatures in God's great big world!

Serenity Inns Dinner Fellowship

Why is Dinner Fellowship So Necessary?

Serenity Inns is a residence for men in recovery from alcohol and/ or drug abuse in Milwaukee. FPLC

members provide 3 dinners a month and share the meal and conversation. Providing and sharing a meal with the residents enables the men to share their stories with others, feel the compassion of a caring community and build their communication skills that have suffered during their times of isolation and addiction.

What to Expect When Volunteering

- Make dinner and take it warm to the Inn by 5:45 pm (for a 6 pm start time). The men will carry your items inside.
- Prepare the meal in your cookware (vs buying aluminum pans) if you like because the men will wash it and carry it to the car at the end of the meal.
- You'll receive an email a week before your date with the number of residents; right now the number is between 9 and 12. You'll be cooking for yourselves, the men and the innkeeper.
- You're usually on your way home by 7 pm.
- Two families, friends, small group members, etc. are welcome to volunteer together to share the meal prep and dining experience.
- This is a popular SOP option for Confirmation students with their families.

Food Needs Continue to Rise

MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary is one recipient of the food we collect each week at FPLC. The guests come to their pantry to be given a week's supply of food, hygiene products, coats, blankets, sleeping bags and other essentials. They also receive a bag lunch assembled and delivered by several groups, FPLC being one of those.

In the area surrounding MBHS, over 44% of residents were already facing food insecurity. With loss of food banks, school lunch programs, Meals on Wheels, SNAP funds and school closings the people they serve are facing mass hunger. MBHS does not depend on federal funding for their operation and programs. They are thankful that some of their weekly food sources are not in peril. All Peoples Church has seen a decrease in the food available (or available at a low price) from some of the federal-

ly-funded organizations that help supply their pantry.

The people both organizations serve are in compounding crisis. The federal funding cuts to the programs mentioned above cause a greater number of people to rely on food pantries. If a pantry is seeing a decrease in donations, they have less food to give an increasing number of people.
