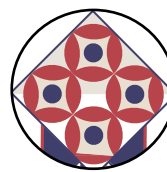
School Supplies for All Peoples Church

We Are Preparing for a Food Access Crisis

—MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary

Cuts to several food assistance programs are projected to affect 48 million Americans. Some of the organizations supplying food pantries are federally funded. What this means for the pantries:

- Less free food and less food variety is available
- Food the pantries purchase for these organizations is getting more expensive

Complicating things, pantries are closing because they can't access enough food; at the same time the need is going up due to grocery costs.

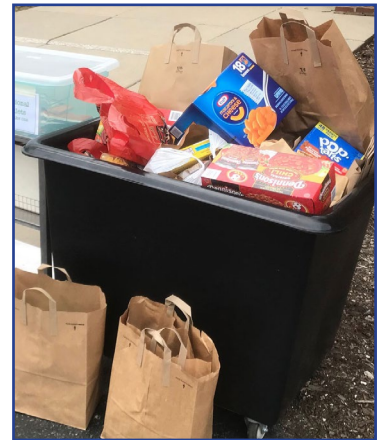
FPLC donates to three food pantries:

- Cross Lutheran Church

- All Peoples Gathering Church

They are looking for additional food sources, seeing an increase in guests, finding it harder to get items like protein and have been told to expect food shortages.

Serenity Inns Dinner Fellowship

Volunteers needed for July and Beyond!

Why is Dinner Fellowship So Necessary?

Serenity Inns is a residence for men in recovery from alcohol and/or drug abuse in Milwaukee. FPLC members provide 3 dinners a month and share the meal and conversation. Providing and sharing a meal with the residents enables the men to share their stories with others, feel the compassion of a caring community and build their communication skills that have suffered during their times of isolation and addiction.

What to Expect When Volunteering

- Make dinner and take it warm to the Inn by 5:45 pm (for a 6 pm start time). The men will carry your items inside.
- Prepare the meal in your cookware (vs buying aluminum pans) if you like because the men will wash it and carry it to the car at the end of the meal.
- You'll receive an email a week before your date with the number of residents; right now the number is between 9 and 12. You'll be cooking for yourselves, the men and the innkeeper.
- You're usually on your way home by 7 pm.

- Two families, friends, small group members, etc. are welcome to volunteer together to share the meal prep and dining experience.
- This is a popular SOP option for Confirmation students with their families.

Hello!

"Be still and know that I am God." – Psalm 46:10

I awoke near midnight and saw two beautiful green eyes staring into my own. Our cat, Ivy, had plopped down on top of me. At just seven pounds, she is so fluffy that I didn't even sense her presence until I blinked. Was she seeking warmth or comfort, maybe a little soft spot to settle in or perhaps she was just afraid. I wondered what motivated her to jump up on our bed. Did she just want to be near me? I became her "audience of one."

Moments with Our Father are like that...we become His "audience of one." We receive special attention from the servant that Jesus Christ became for us here on earth. Like quiet coffee with a good friend, or maybe it's more like a JOLT—Just One Little Thing, that gains our attention. However we become aware of His presence, it becomes a Eureka moment; His love and grace are suddenly with us, and He has captured our hearts and souls.

"When my anxious thoughts multiply within me, your consolations delight my soul."

– Psalm 94:19

How do you describe what it feels like to have God's presence surround your days? For me, it is a kind of assurance, like having a hand to hold on an icy sidewalk, or a calming slow breath when you struggle to catch a breath or having an attentive waiter in a fine restaurant. When we need Him most and notice Him least...that is when He softly seeks us out and welcomes us to the table of love and mercy. Not a disturbance... not a distraction... but a devotion.

We pray-

"Lord, our prayer this week is a simple one; help us to notice you. Help us to quieten our loud minds and centre our distracted hearts. Don't let us miss what you're up to in our lives. Amen."
