Congratulations to Serenity Inns!

Twenty-three years ago, the leaders of a group of Lutheran churches, including our two partners, All Peoples the

Gathering Church and Cross Lutheran Church, founded Serenity Inns. Since then, more than 600 men have found new lives by taking part in Serenity's residential treatment program to free themselves from substance abuse.

Its growth has been miraculous, from one residential treatment house to the purchase of an apartment building where graduates can live while they build futures, to the construction of the new, 14-bed Treatment Center last year. The latest achievement is the opening of a new drop-in center at Redeemer Lutheran Church next to Marquette University.



The Treatment Center

On August 14, Serenity won an important award and a \$1,000 grant for its success from Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment. AHW is a statewide health philanthropy established by the Medical College of Wisconsin and supported by a generous gift from Blue Cross & Blue Shield. The recognition took place at the annual MANDI dinner which celebrates the people, organizations, and projects that are working to revitalize neighborhoods, help residents, and strengthen the community.

FPLC has been involved with supporting Serenity Inns since its start through the dedication of several of our members. Tom Dunst is an Ambassador—a retired member of the board. Lorraine Buehler, also an Ambassador, is committed to Dinner Fellowship and is passionate about including all of you in this rewarding program. You bring the dinner, share the meal, you and the men share your experiences and stories with each other. Your middle school students (and older) are

welcome to join you—it's a great service opportunity for Confirmation students. We have three slots every month—see page 3 to sign up.



The Buehler Alumni House

FPLC member Dave Romoser was key in finding the building that is now called the Buehler Alumni House in honor of Lorraine and her husband Bill. Alumni House has 7 apartments for 14 men to live independently. The project took 4 years with the help of over 100 volunteers, mostly from FPLC. Bill has devoted years of daily work caring for the Inn and renovating the apartment building. He has received several awards but the one, Inspire By Example in 2017 from the Nonprofit Center of Milwaukee, was for leading the renovation of the apartment building.

We hope you'll join our congregation in supporting Milwaukee's break-through program, helping men who are determined to recover from substance abuse.

How to get involved Dinner Fellowship

A terrific way to have a direct impact on the success of the men in the program is through Dinner Fellowship. Graduates of the program often list Dinner Fellowship as one of the things that has helped them most with recovery. They receive caring support and interaction with community members through a meal!

SI's Celebration of Recovery is September 18. By attending, you'll support their mission, learn more about the program and hear directly from the men how Serenity Inns has transformed their lives. It's a moving, inspirational evening!

Serenity Inns Dinner Fellowship

Why is Dinner Fellowship So Necessary?

Serenity Inns is a residence for men in recovery from alcohol and/or drug abuse in Milwaukee. FPLC members provide and share a meal and conversation. This enables the men to share their stories with others, feel the compassion of a caring community and build their communication skills that have suffered during their times of isolation and addiction.

What to Expect When Volunteering

- Make dinner and take it warm to the Inn by 5:45 pm (for a 6 pm start time). The men will carry your items inside.
- Prepare the meal in your cookware (vs buying aluminum pans) if you like because the men will wash it and carry it to the car at the end of the meal.
- You'll receive an email a week before your date with the number of residents; right now the number is between 9 and 12. You'll be cooking for yourselves, the men and the innkeeper.
- You're usually on your way by 7 pm.
- Two families, friends, small group members, etc. are welcome to volunteer together to share the meal prep and dining experience.
- This is a popular SOP option for Confirmation students with their families.

Welcome To Another Year of Kids' Church!

It's Time For College In Tanzania!

As many of you learned on Tanzania Sunday, every August we have the chance to provide a future for a number of young people in our partner parishes in Tanzania. We have the chance to enable them to realize their educational dreams.

College wasn't an option for these students before we started our program in 2014. Since then, our members have provided scholarships to send 84 of them to college. They come from the villages that Pastor Bill visited in January; the depth of the poverty they witnessed is oppressive, but the people remain happy and positive for the future.

This year, because of your generosity, we have decided to support 18 students instead of 15. Their applications just arrived after being screened by the education committee in Tanzania. Our team will go over each one carefully, too, including those from the ten returning students. If history is any guide, some sponsors will want to continue their support, but it's possible we'll be looking for new sponsors as well.

Sponsorship can be by an individual, a couple, or a small group (church, friends, family). Of the 18, here's the breakdown, by cost (tuition, books, and university fees for a full year) for what the students need:

 \$1000 - \$1544
 \$500 - \$888
 Under \$500

 4 students
 8 Students
 6 Students

Because several students have written about hunger and living expenses in their applications, we are also looking into other ways that we might help. Depending on the town/city:



Hello!

"... He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." ... Simon answered,... "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets."... when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking... they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink." – Luke 5: 4-7

Casting a line for walleye on Little Twin Lake was a summertime family tradition. Unlike Jesus' disciples, our catch did not include the tilapia or catfish caught in the Sea of Galilee. Yucky leaches clung to the bottom of our boat, but mostly I remember the hot sun shimmering over the water and lacy dragonflies hovering nearby. Jesus knew and taught all the worthy attributes of a good fisherman... to be patient and observant...to be a little fearless... to be faithful to the task and determined...to love our helpers, and maybe even be a bit adventurous! Requirements for Jesus' recruits...and we are also Jesus' recruits.
