K5-6th Grades



Serenity Inns Dinner FellowshipWhy is Dinner Fellowship So Necessary?

Serenity Inns is a residence for men in recovery from alcohol and/or drug abuse in Milwaukee. FPLC members provide and share a meal and conversation. This enables the men to share their stories with others, feel the compassion of a caring community and build their communication skills that have suffered during their times of isolation and addiction.

What to Expect When Volunteering

- Make or purchase (see info below) dinner and take it warm to the Inn by 5:45 pm (for a 6 pm start time). The men will carry your items inside.
- Any cookware you bring will be washed by the men.
- You receive an email a week before your date with the number of residents; now the number is between 9 and 12. You cook for yourselves, the men and the innkeeper.
- You're usually on your way by 7 pm.
- Two families, friends, small group members, etc. are welcome to volunteer together to share the meal prep and dining experience.
- This is a popular SOP for Confirmation students (with their parent(s)).





Hello!

"For thou wilt light my candle; the Lord my God will enlighten my darkness."

– Psalm 18:28

Have you ever watched a candle burning low, all the way to the end of its beautiful life? It's a treat to see it brand new, standing tall in a glass jar, perhaps your favorite scent, the wick snipped and ready for you to strike a match and see it ignite! From the first flame to the last spark, the warmth and glow is captivating, and the smell of cloves or lemon or holiday cookies can stir up wonderful memories.

As we watched our Sunday service online, something was missing...we needed a candle, actually, the light of a candle. A candle not yet lit, is not yet living...it needs a flame, it needs to burn brightly to come alive. Our spiced pumpkin variety had very little wick left, the flame barely flickering above the thin coating of wax. Without the flame it could offer just color and scent, but the burning, the life of it, now that was the intent of the beautiful design of the maker all along.

"No one, when he has lit a candle, puts it in a secret place or under a basket, but on a candlestick, that those who come may see the light." – Luke 11:33

Like our Heavenly Father, designing us to burn bright...to live well...to savor every moment, we are a little like candles. Perhaps it's simply about sharing and showing...our light, our love, our grace illuminating and brightening the way for others. One candle lighting another...one love for Our Father and one another burning brightly!
