A FPLC family recently volunteered for dinner fellowship on a Saturday evening at Serenity Inn and very much enjoyed their time with the men. They appreciated the conversation over dinner, especially the candor on display when the men shared their experiences in recovery and their life before finding a path to recovery. Many had been in other recovery programs and were realizing that the program at Serenity Inn was giving them more tools to use moving forward. The men felt *this time* could be the time they would find long-term recovery.

Our members also heard stories of the difficulty the men were having finding jobs; they wonder if any of our members might know of job opportunities for the men at Serenity Inn.

We consulted Jason Dobson, the Director of Operations at Serenity Inn, to ask about this. Jason is enthusiastic about the possibilities and says,

“We are open to different kinds of jobs due to the various skill levels of our men. Preferably, shifts would be first or third shift jobs due to SI programming. The big thing would be that the job would need to be close to a bus line.”

The Marriage You Always Wanted

If you've been married for more than a minute, you already know this: marriage is wonderful... and marriage is work. And sometimes it's not the big dramatic moments that wear us down—it's the ordinary stuff. The hurried conversations. The unmet expectations. The "I thought you knew..." moments. The season where you look up and realize, we're living in the same house, but we're not really connecting like we used to.

Many couples over the years who genuinely love each other still feel stuck. And honestly, many of us don't need a "marriage crisis" to benefit from encouragement—we just need a little help getting back to what matters most.

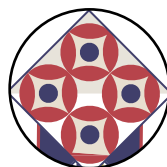

Hello!

*"For the whole law is fulfilled on one word; "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."
– Galatians 5:14*

Just this morning, a fellow across the street reached out to greet his neighbor with a snow shovel. An odd sort of hello, but the other guy's small implement was way under-powered for the heavy wet snowfall we'd received – this would have been an uphill climb! The shovel was in his left hand accompanied by a hearty handshake with his right. An interesting handoff, it was unclear whether or not they even knew each other, but for sure his neighbor was his helper. Top that one – a neighbor we barely know kindly shoveled our front walk "just because" ...talk about some real brotherly love!

"The Pharisee asked, "Teacher, which command in the law is the most important? Jesus answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind. This is the first and most important command. And the second command is like the first: Love your neighbor as you love yourself." – Matthew 22: 36-39

Two tellings, one from the lips of Jesus in Matthew, one related by the apostle, Paul in his letter to the early Christians in Galatia. A message of such importance – embracing our love for God in the same way as we do so for our neighbors...aligning our hearts with His. Include all, not just our families and close friends...and exclude none...letting our love transform all those whose lives touch ours...anyone...and everyone. Relationships bound together in love and grace, not merely compliance with a statute, rather with the heartstrings that weave us together as humans.

Father, thank you for your constant care of our hearts and souls. Help us to be open to all possibilities, to dwell in a sphere of grace and love for all...to follow your light and pass it on to others. Amen.
