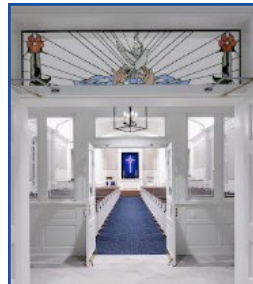

## Help Feed Our Community—The Need Continues

Food insecurity is not new in our community, but the need is growing. Recent changes to SNAP have left some without access to food assistance, and many of the neighborhoods our partner pantries serve are food deserts—places where only small convenience or liquor stores are available for groceries. At the same time, rising prices mean every dollar stretches less. For those on limited incomes, food pantries are increasingly essential to help bridge the gap.

### A Plea: Please Prioritize Being Part of Sustaining MBHS as a Food Safety Net

Food scarcity has worsened due to 3 nearby supermarkets closing recently. As we deplete our food resources each week, you help to replenish!

We are a crucial food resource to 200+ households and individuals per week coming to our 7-8 weekly outreach events. Please continue to be part of our food initiatives. We have this opportunity to feed truly food-scarce and hungry people. Nutritious food helps reverse the toxicity of lead poisoning in all ages.

### All Peoples Food Pantry Update

Last year, 5,149 individuals visited the All Peoples pantry, representing 18,739 people when including their family members. This was about a 5% increase from 2024.

During the government shutdown late last year, the “church” responded. The response from our partners, was a miracle. We had 10 partners show up with over 15 pick-up trucks, vans and cars full of food and it made feeding the 300 families for the 2 weeks of no SNAP benefits possible!

Not only did it make those 2 weeks easy to feed our guests, it has continued to this day.

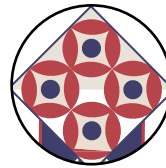
